Join Susan Cahill, author of The World Between the Rain, for an interactive storytelling adventure exploring portals, emotions, and the power of imagination—what happens when we step into the unknown, and how stories help us understand ourselves.

Create Your Own Story Illustration will be an open activity which encourages creative freedom in a collective artwork. Visitors will be welcomed to sketch and doodle on a large blank space and by the end of the festival a collaborative illustration mural will represent the event. Bec Tonks will assist and encourage an outpouring of doodles and illustrations alongside adding her own as we explore drawing and visual storytelling together.

Ian Douglas is a Storyteller and Theatre Maker who works extensively across the British Isles. With over 20 years of experience delivering storytelling, performance and theatre activities for schools, arts organisations, communities, and festivals across Britain, he has developed a practise approach which mixes sensitivity, comedic energy and wit leading to a style all of his own.

The origins of Ian's work are steeped in the traditions of street theatre which has helped him

develop his unique storytelling style. His work has been described as 'truly inspirational' and draws upon a rich vein of British folk tales and world myths.

Matthew tells some of his favourite stories for families. Travel with him to India to meet a Raja who, above all else, loves cheese. Or perhaps a trip to Japan where lives the smallest boy in the world

And Matthew will also be doing his new one man show Forest Tales of the Olden World, a storytelling show.

In a far future, a young girl reflects on her grandmother's stories. Stories of an ancient, forgotten world. Our world.
